

After high school graduation, Linda went to Arizona State University where she graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Elementary Education, and met her future husband, Dick Rees. The couple married in 1963, then moved to Amberg, Germany, where Dick served in the US Army. Through the Department of Defense, Linda taught first grade on the military base where they lived.

When they returned home, the couple had a son, John, and a daughter, Noel. Linda was a stay-at-home mom for ten years before returning to teaching.
