Having worked on the San Diego sports scene since 1963, Bob Chandler, a beloved longtime Tierrasanta resident, has plenty more stories like this, including some fun inside anecdotes about Tony Gwynn, Randy Jones, Tim Flannery, Ken Caminiti, and many others. And boy does he have some stories!



San Diego sports scene full-time in 1963. During his career, Chandler has done play-by-play of the NFL's San Diego Chargers, the NBA's San Diego (now Houston) Rockets, San Diego State University football, basketball, and baseball, as well as numerous other college and high school sports.



He has worked for three different TV stations in San Diego, delivering the regular evening sportscasts and interviews. In 1972, Chandler joined Jerry Coleman as the TV/radio broadcasters for the Padres. Associated with the Padres from 1970-2003, he likely knows more than almost anyone when it comes to San Diego baseball.

Highlights from the Board of Directors Meeting March 26, 2015

Motions were made, seconded and approved to appoint Linda Rees as the new President of the Board and to appoint Mike Rigdon as Treasurer. The Board discussed the vacant Vice President position. The Board intends to see if any member of the Village would be interested in filling this position.

Village bookkeeping is to be transferred in-house thereby saving \$140/month. Mike Sheehan, Executive Director, will be working with Mike Rigdon, our new Treasurer. Our bank accounts will be transferred from North Island Credit Union to the more accessible Chase Bank. The new account will be set up for two signatories on each check.

Our postal address is transferred to the UPS Store from USPS. We will pay less money for a bigger box. Mike Sheehan will institute a Volunteer of the Month award and will plan a Volunteer Recognition Gala.

There was discussion of the (ever elusive) Senior Center for Tierrasanta. The Hex building is not viable at this time.

The open forum included discussion of insurance...we have Directors, Officers and General Liability.


