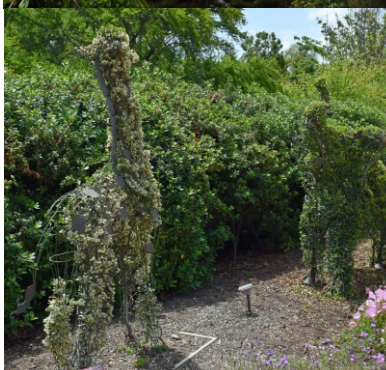

Hiking With Bob

Do not register on website; email,
phone, or just show up. A couple of years
ago when this group was formed, the
consensus was that few members would want
to start before 9 AM. At a recent Rueda
neighborhood group meeting of about 20+
people, the reverse feeling was touted by a lot
of attendees. So we'll try moving the start time
of the longer hikes earlier to 8:30 AM. Also
even though I learned as a child that the high
temperature for the day is usually at about 3
PM, and we normally finish long before then;
there's still the opinion that it gets too hot to
walk in the sun in San Diego in the summer. So
we'll shorten the longer hikes to 1.5 hours
(Jun-October), so as to end at 10 AM.

**1.5 hour/1.5+ mile (Mission Trails),
Rim trail down into Suycott Wash then up to
the bottom of the steps up South Fortuna.
On Fri, 01 Jun 2018 (first Friday),** we gather
at 8:30 AM. (Drive east on Clairemont Mesa
Blvd to the last right turn - Rueda Drive; go
south three blocks to Calle de Vida, turn left;
drive to "L" intersection with Colina Dorado;
stop/park.) This walk is both on 6' wide utility
roads & 3' wide dirt trails. There's chaparral
(including some cactus) and stream related
lush vegetation (& oaks). The views are
outstanding.

**1.5 hour/1.5+ mile (Tierrasanta
Canyons), West Shepherd (short) Loop.
On Fri, 15 Jun 2018 (third Friday),** we gather
at 8:30 AM. (Meet at the ATM up the north end
of the Vons shopping center, right next to
Santo.) We'll look over & hike two canyons
(mostly) south of Clairemont Mesa Blvd that
are normally not often explored. There are 3'
wide routes & canyon top walks. Enjoy the
feeling of living in a community with all these
water courses amongst our housing projects.

6/8: The USS Midway Story (Updated for 2018)

How did the USS Midway Museum become the 5th most popular museum of any type in the United States (35,000 museums!)? 7/13: Surprises, Milestones & Disasters

The USS Midway—America’s longest-serving aircraft carrier of the 20th century—had its share of hair-raising missions, pranks, heartbreaking disasters, and remarkable accomplishments. Shared by about 150,000 sailors whose average age was only 19! Find out why “Midway Magic” because universally known throughout the Navy.

8/10: The Battle of Midway: How America Won the Pacific War

The U.S. Navy had no business winning the Battle of Midway in 1942. The Americans were outgunned and outmanned following the devastating attack at Pearl Harbor. Yet codebreaking, daring leadership, and extraordinary heroism led to the most remarkable victory in U.S. Navy history. And it became the turning point in the Pacific in World War II and the inspiration behind naming the USS Midway three years later.

9/14: A Day in the Life of a Naval Aviator (New for 2018)

From bunks to ready rooms to cockpits, walk alongside a Naval aviator throughout a day filled with flight ops, potential disaster, rigorous accountability, trust, training, and teamwork. An insider’s view, reviewed by former aviators now serving as docents aboard the USS Midway Museum.

Did you know that only about 5% of the USS Midway’s 4,500 crew were pilots? That the other 95% operated a floating city at sea—restaurants, barber shops, city utilities, convenience stores, police, hospital, newspaper, hotels, laundry and much more—so that the pilots could launch when the nation called. Explore this floating city at sea, all within the confines of three football fields!

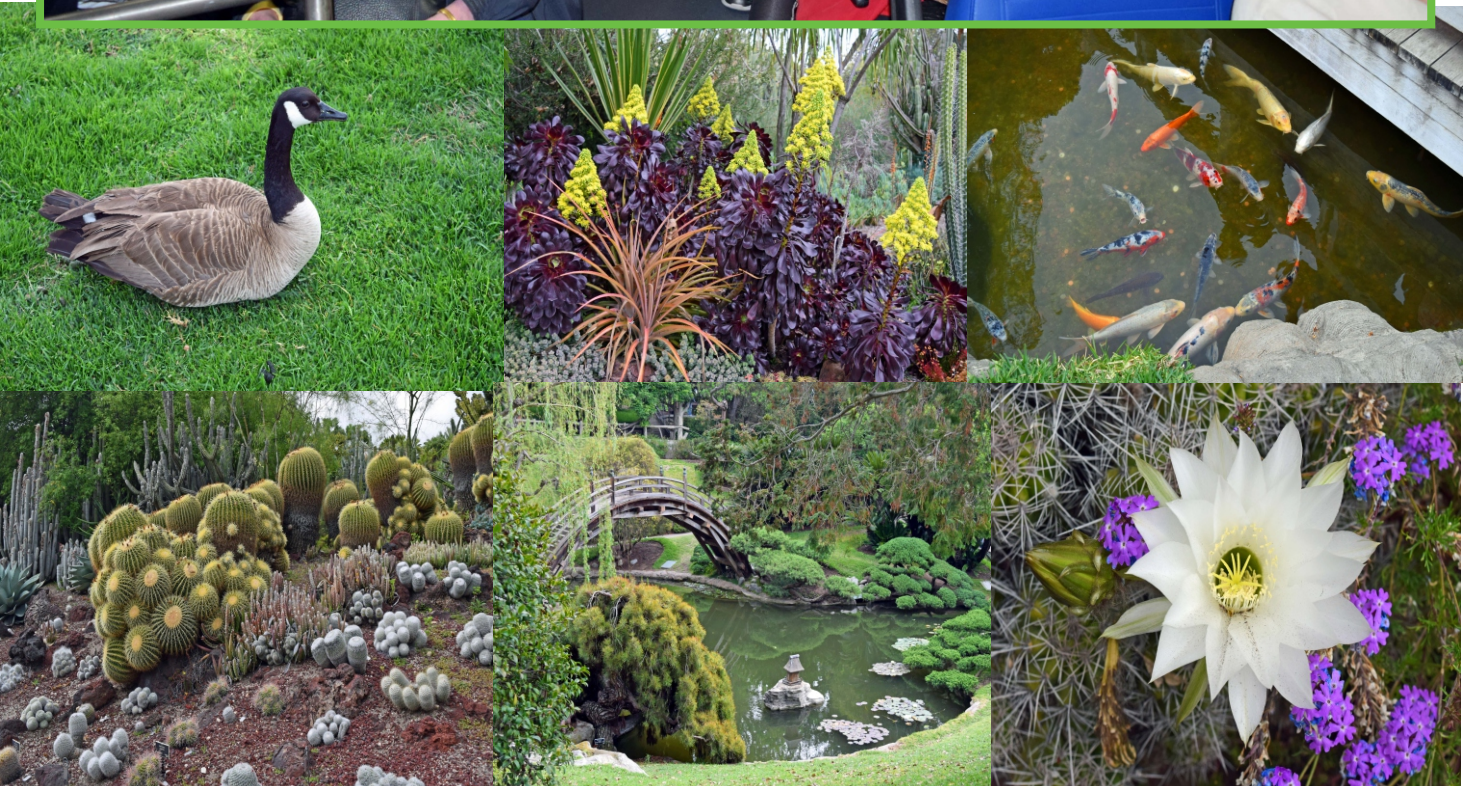
