Someone You Should Know.....by Carol Lee

Joyce Greenstreet was born in St. Louis, Missouri and lived most of her growing-up years in Festus, MO. Her father, like so many others, joined the U.S. Army during WWII. When he came back, after serving as an apprentice with his brother-in-law, he became a sheet metal worker and followed that career until his retirement. Her mother was a stay-at-home mom. Both of Joyce's parents volunteered, almost as a way of life, and were a powerful example to their children -- Joyce and two brothers.

Joyce attended the University of Missouri for 2 ½ years. In February of 1969, she and her roommate visited Joyce's brother, who was in the Navy and stationed in San Diego. That was it: they were hooked on San Diego. The two girls moved into Joyce's brother's Mission Beach apartment when he was deployed to WestPac.

In March, Joyce started working at Cubic Defense Systems. She married James Parsons in 1973 and, they purchased a home in Villa Monterey in 1977. Joyce & Jim later divorced, but she remained a Tierrasantan. Part of the job that she loved the most was the travel that her position as a Product Support Manager afforded. She frequently traveled to Washington, D. C., Eglin AFB, Florida and Salt Lake City, Utah. But she was also able to visit Korea, Italy, Canada and Taiwan on several occasions. She met Jerry Muinos, an electrical engineer with Cubic, when they were both assigned to a project in Sardinia, Italy. Joyce spent a year there, and Jerry was there for two years. When he returned, they started dating and married in May of 1993. Joyce left Cubic in 1995 to spend more time with her mother in Missouri, and Jerry retired not long after, but he returned often as a consultant.

Joyce inherited her parents' volunteering spirit. When working at Cubic, she had watched the construction of the Polinsky Children's Center in Kearny Mesa and knew it was a place she wanted to investigate when she retired. Joyce began volunteering at the nonprofit Child Abuse Prevention Foundation (now, Promises2Kids). She mainly did fund raising and administrative work. She also volunteered for the SD Humane Society, working on mobile adoption events. Both jobs were enjoyable and fulfilling, but she wanted a local connection. Joyce joined the Tierrasanta Junior Women's Club in 1996 and has served as their President seven times, as well as holding multiple Board positions through the years. She is not on the Board currently, but holds several Committee Chair positions. In 2007, Joyce was recruited by the Tierrasanta Foundation to join their eight-member Board, and is now planning Tierrasanta's 50th Anniversary Celebration in 2021. She was TF Board President for two years and is currently the Secretary.

As part of her Junior Women's Club work, Joyce organized a Holiday Boutique and Craft Fair at the Rec Center in 2010, where Susan Deininger talked with her about the newlyforming TVSD. Joyce attended a get-acquainted Board meeting and, "When I left the meeting, I was a member of the Board." Joyce particularly enjoyed working with Pam Chapman, TVSD's Executive Director at the time, doing social and educational activities, and fundraising (read: fun-raising) activities. She enjoys TVSD's social and educational events, especially the Member-to-Member Forums, like the sharing Forum on Grief. This August, Joyce retired from our TVSD board. In the past ten years, she has served variously as Treasurer, Community Liaison, President for two years, and a Board position as Past President.

In 2018, within a month, Joyce's two brothers died, one in his 60s of Alzheimer's, and the other at 75 of lung cancer. On the happy family side, Joyce and Jerry have seven "adorable, gorgeous, lovely, wonderful nieces and nephews, twelve great, and three great-great nieces and nephews. Some of their best times are times spent with their family!

Words to live by: Joyce's mom and dad told her that she was capable of doing anything and everything, and they fully supported her endeavors.
