# Someone You Should Know.....by Carol Lee

Marty Sandman's future mom and dad lived in Cincinnati, Ohio within just a few miles of each other. They met on a blind date, playing tennis at a local municipal tennis court. His dad worked most of his career as a traveling salesman, then worked for several years for the State of Ohio in the Tax Department as a Team Leader. His mother was a legal secretary and stopped working when Marty was born. The couple had a second son six years later. When Marty was ten and his little brother was in first grade, his mother returned to work. Marty's dad died at 67, and his mom lived to the age of 92.

Marty and Judy married in 1965. He was in U.S. Army ROTC as a Second Lieutenant at Fort Monmouth, NJ. When he was deployed to Vietnam, Judy and their young son lived with her parents in Dayton, OH. After a year in Vietnam, Marty was discharged, and in 1968 began working for NCR Corporation in Dayton. They bought a house near Judy's parents and were there for almost three years.

Marty was transferred to San Diego at the age of thirty, when NCR was opening a new plant to build computers in Rancho Bernardo. He had been working with the software for those computers in Dayton and was well-prepared. Marty and Judy moved to Tierrasanta in 1972.

Marty and Judy have a son (Marty) and a daughter (Jill). Jill and her husband have a daughter who is almost 15. The whole family is able to get together often, because Marty and Jill live in the area. Jill has a Master's in Communication from USD, and Marty has taken courses there, as well, maintaining something of a family tradition: Marty Sr. had earned his MBA at USD in the 70s, and years later, Judy worked full time in the housing office at USD. Judy finished her Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Education at USD, but didn't go into teaching, as she was promoted to be the Assistant Director of the Housing Office and continued working at USD for over twenty years.

Marty retired in 2004, after 34 years with NCR. He then had his own consulting practice in data analytics until 2010, although he continued his teaching. Over the span of 24 years he taught part-time for West Coast University, National University, and then Mira Mar Junior College.

Judy joined TVSD before Marty, encouraged by her friends, Ginny Berlin and Linda Rees, who already were members. Marty would drive Judy to events and sometimes participated as a non-member. He became a member in 2012 and cemented friendships with about twenty other members who traveled together on a trip to South America. A couple of years later, he began playing pool weekly at the VMC clubhouse, until the pandemic. He is on the IT Committee with Greg Zweibel, Don Stewart, and Bradlyn Mulvey, often doing research projects.

Marty is currently developing iPhone apps which he submits to Apple for review. When they are approved, they go into the Apple Store. He writes catalog

descriptions and creates a You Tube video to describe each app. He had four apps approved right when the iPhone was new. For the next nine years he worked on new apps, and soon will have a new one ready, which he thinks will be commercially successful.

After talking with Marty, I think I sensed that I can pass along these "Words to live by" - - "Keep your mind active and never stop being creative."
