Cassandra Ann Reichenbacher was born and raised in Walnut Creek, CA, in the East Bay area of San Francisco. She was an only child who played softball constantly, but as the teams became more competitive, they no longer felt like recreational fun and she decided not to play for college.

She attended California State University in Monterey Bay, a new, small school on the peninsula and close to home. She visited her mom and dad every month. She enjoyed the chance for some home cooking and the access to her parents' washer and dryer. The college was near Salinas Valley, 'the salad bowl of the world', and the area was rich with tourism. Cassandra was always a servant, by nature, and she decided to work toward a business degree with an emphasis in hospitality management.

After earning her degree, Cassandra landed an internship at the famous Pebble Beach Resorts, one of the top golf courses in the world—at that time, it cost \$500.00 to play a round--and a two-night stay was also required at \$500.00 per night. Cassandra started in concierge services. She liked the luxury and the whole field of hotel management. She completed their management training program, and in nine months, she was made Assistant Manager at a sister property. She learned to golf (free to employees) on their world-renowned courses. An opportunity for a management position in marketing opened up, involving partnerships with such brands as Coca Cola, FedEx, Visa, and Lexus. There were a lot of perks available with the job, and she enjoyed it very much.

Cassandra left this great job, however, because she had met a gentleman, a former helicopter pilot, who was studying for his Master's Degree in Applied Physics at the naval postgraduate school in Monterey Bay. After graduation, Cassandra's new husband, Patrick Hanrahan, was equipped to handle 'satellite and GPS-type work' for the Navy. He was assigned to the Pentagon, and they lived in Alexandria, Virginia, for three years.

She loved movies (her favorite was "The Sound of Music"), songs of the 40's, and Broadway tunes. She loved singing along with the radio and our 45 rpm records. She was a stickler for grammar, punctuation, and handwriting. All of our homework essays, compositions, and spelling sentences were proofread by Mom. And we would have to redo any papers that were too messy or were not properly written. She patiently listened as we spelled the week's vocabulary words each Thursday evening before the Friday test. (Dad checked over the math and science homework.)

An only child, she took parenting five children very seriously, but always made it an enjoyable experience for us all!
