Someone You Should Know.....by Carol Lee

Jean Utterback was born in Kansas City, Missouri. She grew up in a very rural community close to Hannibal. She was the second of nine kids; she had six brothers and two sisters, who remain close to this day. The siblings still meet each year at reunion locations around the country.

When Jean was eighteen years old, her sister and her husband moved to California while he was a marine stationed at Camp Pendleton. She lived with them while going to school at Oceanside-Carlsbad Junior College (now MiraCosta College). When her brother-in-law left the service, he and her sister moved back to Missouri. Like many visitors to our area, Jean had become hooked on California, but when they left, she did too. She attended Northeast Missouri State University (now Truman State) in Kirksville, MO. She earned her teaching credentials in Secondary English and Social Studies. Jean was the first member of the family to graduate from college, beating an older sister by only two months. During her long career, Jean taught high school English in Ohio, Missouri, and Iowa, and English as a Second Language in California.

When Jean returned to California she worked for ten years with the Vietnamese population, first as a volunteer with the refugees at Camp Pendleton where she learned to love teaching English as a Second Language--and then created a program for Asian students in the Sweetwater School District. She did post-graduate work at SDSU, earning Master's Degrees in Curriculum and Administration, and then 'went to the dark side', as she was teased a bit for going into administration.

Jean worked in Grossmont for ten years as Director of Special Projects, mostly for underserved populations, which included grant writing for those projects. After ten years, she took additional coursework to increase her knowledge in the field of elementary education. She became the Principal of Aviara Oaks Elementary in Carlsbad, as they were building a middle school contiguous to the elementary school and wanted someone with her extensive experience. Jean's last assignment was as Principal of Carmel del Mar Elementary School. She remained active in education after she retired, as a consultant for the San Diego County Office of Education, helping to implement the Williams Act legislation which looked at equity concerns in low-performing schools in the county.

Jean was married to John Kerr for over thirty years and gladly gained four stepsons. John, too, was a career educator, working for the San Diego Unified School District, and his avocation was aviation. Jean and John enjoyed many years of travel to such places as Europe, Thailand, South America, and Africa. She was active in Rotary for over fifteen years. John retired fifteen years before Jean did, and they continued to travel extensively.

After Jean retired, she and John saw an ad about TVSD. They were eager to join. Jean saw this as an opportunity to volunteer in her own community now that she had the time. She was soon Co-chair of the Care Committee. She was very active from the outset and busy with various activities, including organizing programs such as the member-to-member sessions, playing bridge, and participating in Book Club. John had a hangar at Gillespie Field and once even had men from TVSD there for lunch. John passed away in 2016. Jean has remained active in TVSD as a member of the Care Committee and, recently, on the team responsible for the roll-out of the Stronger Memory Program.

Jean's words to live by came from her mom: "We can decide every morning how we want to live each day." From a very early age, Jean knew that she wanted to act in service to others, and each day she asks herself, "What can I learn and how can I help make things easier for others?"
